Roll Call of Organisations and Residents

74 attendees were recorded as being present. Attendees were advised that the meeting was to be recorded and photographed at some point in the evening.

1. Chair's Welcome and Executive AGM Report

"I would like to welcome everyone to our Neighbourhood Forum, especially to anyone attending for the first time or new to Uppingham. I am Janet Thompson your Chair, As usual we have a full and exciting agenda, I will introduce everyone as we go through the evening. Hopefully you will all have received our latest newsletter through your door.

So am going to do 1st & 2nd Agenda items together because I wanted to start by giving you some information about the Forum, I want to dispel rumours and Chinese whispers.

The Uppingham Neighbourhood Forum was set up well before my time, I took over as Chair about 10 years ago because I wanted to know more about Uppingham. We are made up of representatives from various sections of our Town. We are all volunteers, we are not 'self serving' but have one main interest, that is to help to improve the quality of life in Uppingham and put Uppingham first and foremost.

Our representatives are from: The Limes, Firs & Spurs, The Beeches, and The Elms residents associations, The Churches in Uppingham, The Brownies, Town Twinning, Housing, Education, The Uppingham Surgery PPG. WI, Mothers Union and Uppingham in Bloom, We do have some Councillors on the Forum Executive but they represent their own resident's associations. This is not a 'political' group. We just wish to bring our residents information in any way that we can. So, If there is any other group that would like to be represented in the Forum Exec please let me know.

Many organisations, associations and charities reply heavily on volunteers and we are blessed to have lots of volunteer in Uppingham and Rutland covering a wide range of organisations which help to support our community. We should celebrate ALL our volunteers and not criticise them; I see many people who give up their time to help others in many ways and it truly makes a difference.

The Forum is supported by Uppingham First, which in itself was set up to take on some activities that the Council were unable to carry out.

At this point I want to take the opportunity to thank our outgoing Chair of Uppingham First, Alderman Edward Baines for all his hard work and support over the years and we wish him a relaxing retirement.

Janet reported that the AGM of the Forum Executive had been held on August 1st 2024. The draft annual report and financial update were read, and accepted, The Forum's annual expenditure was well within its budget.

Janet confirmed that she had been re-elected as Chair of UNF (for her impartiality) and that the meeting had also agreed to put her name forward to UTC for her to be considered as the UNF representative on the Neighbourhood Plan Sub-Committee.

Mark Shaw was re-elected as Vice Chair of the Forum for 2024/25 and Ron Simpson BEM re-elected as the Forum Coordinator. The meeting discussed the update of the Community Emergency Plan and the town's progress with Neighbourhood Watch. Finally, the AGM approved updated equality and safeguarding policies.

2. Community Group Updates

Janet brought this agenda item forward to allow representatives from the various organisations present to inform the meeting of their events.

Henry Dawe spoke about the event called "Cheer Up" which takes place at the Uppingham Theatre in October: Leaflets were distributed by the Forum on his behalf and leaflets were available during the meeting. Henry also gave an update on Uppingham Town Twinning and the exciting trip to Caudebec-en-Caux planned for the end of October.

Hilary Dawe gave an update on the Women's Institute.

Lyn encouraged everyone to support the Rotary Eyebrook Walk on Sunday 18th August. This was in aid of Loros.

Janet gave an update on Mothers Union and mentioned the 'Round Rutland Classis Car Run" on 1st September. This event was also advertised in the Forum Newsletter which had been distributed to every household.

3. Crime and Policing Update

The Leicestershire and Rutland Police had sent us the new Area Commander's Update for Melton and Rutland and this was displayed on the screen. This newsletter was for one week and the printed date was 15th August 2024.

The meeting had invited PC Rebecca Angel to speak on neighbourhood matters, but she was unable to attend due to a training course commitment. Janet reported that we were expecting PCSO Andy Wylie in her place, who had now sent his apologies for absence due to illness.

We have received the last 3 months crime report and statistics, which were displayed on the screen for all to read. Janet stated that she was unable to answer any questions because she is not employed by the Police and PC Rebecca Angel has asked that any questions be directed to her. The Police Office is situated on the right hand side of the lobby area in the Town Hall.

4. Youth Space

Liz Clarke gave an excellent talk regarding the Youth Space Group and how and when it was set up, who is involved in the volunteering and how they had recently managed to secure a substantial Lottery Grant. This

Grant will secure the group for a few years but they do have extensive expenditure for one paid youth worker, food and the cost of hiring the Town Hall.

Liz introduced Chloe, one of the Youth Space attendees, who gave an inspiring speech on how the Youth Group had helped her and many other youngsters. 5. Uppingham Surgery Update

John Leslie, Chair of the Uppingham Patient Participation Group gave an update on the surgery activities, the vaccination programme for Covid, the winter Flue jab and imminent improvements to the waiting room. The Uppingham Surgery Newsletter was available at the meeting. Statistics regarding the surgery workload including appointments, telephone calls etc were displayed on the screen. John closed by inviting questions from the floor.

6. Town Council Update

Uppingham Town Mayor David Ainslie BEM introduced recently appointed Town Clerk Adam Lowe. Adam addressed the meeting briefly setting out his immediate actions upon taking up his appointment at the beginning of the week.

7. Uppingham Post Office

Forum Coordinator Ron Simpson BEM updated Forum attendees on the efforts being made behind the scenes to ensure the continuity of a post office in Uppingham once the current Postmaster Robin Bromiley retired. Ron confirmed that the present post office building had now been registered as a community asset by the county council thus ensuring that the community would be given 6 months notice of any proposed sale.

8. Any Other Business

At our next Forum meeting it is hoped to have Doreen Woodward CEO of St. Johns & St. Annes which covers Bonner & Taylor House as a speaker. Janet thanked everyone for attending. These notes will be available on www.uppinghamfirst.co.uk under the 'Forum' section.
